

## **ACE SUPPORTS the following proposed legislation:**

### **S. 517 – Consumer and Fuel Retailer Choice Act**

*Would extend the RVP waiver to fuel blends containing gasoline and ten percent or more ethanol.*

**Sponsors:** Senators Deb Fischer (R-NE), Joe Donnelly (D-IN), Chuck Grassley (R-IA)

**Co-Sponsors:** 16

### **H.R. 1311 – Consumer and Fuel Retailer Choice Act**

*Would extend the RVP waiver to fuel blends containing gasoline and ten percent or more ethanol.*

**Sponsors:** Congressman Adrian Smith (R-NE03) and Congressman David Loebsack (D-IA02)

**Co-Sponsors:** 44

## **ACE OPPOSES the following proposed legislation:**

### **S. 2519 – Growing Renewable Energy through Existing and New Environmentally Responsible Fuels Act (GREENER Fuels)**

*Would phase out the conventional corn ethanol mandate by 2 billion gallons per year starting in 2023, eliminating it by 2030. Would maintain the RFS volumes for cellulosic biofuels until production either reaches 2 billion gallons or 2037.*

**Sponsor:** Senator Tom Udall (R-NM). **Co-Sponsors:** 0

### **H.R. 5212 – Growing Renewable Energy through Existing and New Environmentally Responsible Fuels Act (GREENER Fuels)**

*Would phase out the conventional corn ethanol mandate by 2 billion gallons per year starting in 2023, eliminating it by 2030. Would maintain the RFS volumes for cellulosic biofuels until production either reaches 2 billion gallons or 2037.*

**Sponsor:** Congressman Peter Welch (R-VTAL). **Co-Sponsors:** 0

### **H.R. 1314 – The Renewable Fuel Standard Elimination Act**

*This bill would repeal the RFS.*

**Sponsor:** Congressman Bob Goodlatte (R-VA06). **Co-Sponsors:** 67

### **H.R. 1315 – The RFS Reform Act**

*Amends the RFS to eliminate the conventional ethanol requirement, sets a 10% cap on the amount of ethanol that can be blended into gasoline and reduces the total amount of renewable fuel required to be blended between 2017 and 2022.*

**Sponsor:** Congressman Bob Goodlatte (R-VA06). **Co-Sponsors:** 55

### **H.R. 777 – Would reverse EPA's approval of E15 and require more unnecessary testing for higher ethanol blends.**

**Sponsor:** Congressman James Sensenbrenner (R-WI05) **Co-Sponsor:** 2 (DeFazio, OR-4, Ross FL-15)

### **H.R. 119 – LEVEL Act (Leave Ethanol Volumes at Existing Levels Act)**

*Would repeal Renewable Fuel Standard II, keeping RFS I volumes intact.*

**Sponsor:** Congressman Michael Burgess (R-TX26) **Co-Sponsors:** 0
